Attending college was important to Chelsea. "I wanted to go to college so that I would be able to find fulfilling work and a career that I love. I am a first-generation college student. Being able to go to the college that challenged me and gave me a wonderful education was life-changing for me and my family."

My motivation [in going to college] was to create a great career that I loved. As a first-generation college student, I also wanted to inspire my siblings to attend.

Chelsea credits the support of VSAC and The Curtis Fund for her success. She says, "Without the support from VSAC and The Curtis Fund, I would not have been able to attend college due to the cost. The Curtis Fund scholarship was a huge factor in my decision to go to college because it helped with the amount of loans that I had to take out, so I graduated without a large amount of debt. I would not have been able to attend college without this important financial assistance."

Her other support has been her family. "My family has been a huge influence on me. They inspire me every day and have supported me through my college and career journey." Being the oldest of four, Chelsea hoped to inspire her siblings. "Both my sister and brother are currently in college and my youngest brother will be a senior in high school in the coming year and will be doing his senior year and first year of college at CCV next year. All of my siblings and I have been involved in VSAC and have also received Curtis Fund scholarships.'

Chelsea says, "The VSAC program and The Curtis Fund are so important in being able to help low-income, first-generation students and so many other students afford college. Without a college education it is so difficult to create a career that you love and that can support you. Having a scholarship fund, like The Curtis Fund, that helps people achieve their education and career goals, is an incredibly important fund to have."
